Client ID

For authentication purposes Amazon users need a Login with Amazon ClientID

Step 1 : Access you Amazon Payments Account and click on Login with Amazon from the dropdown list

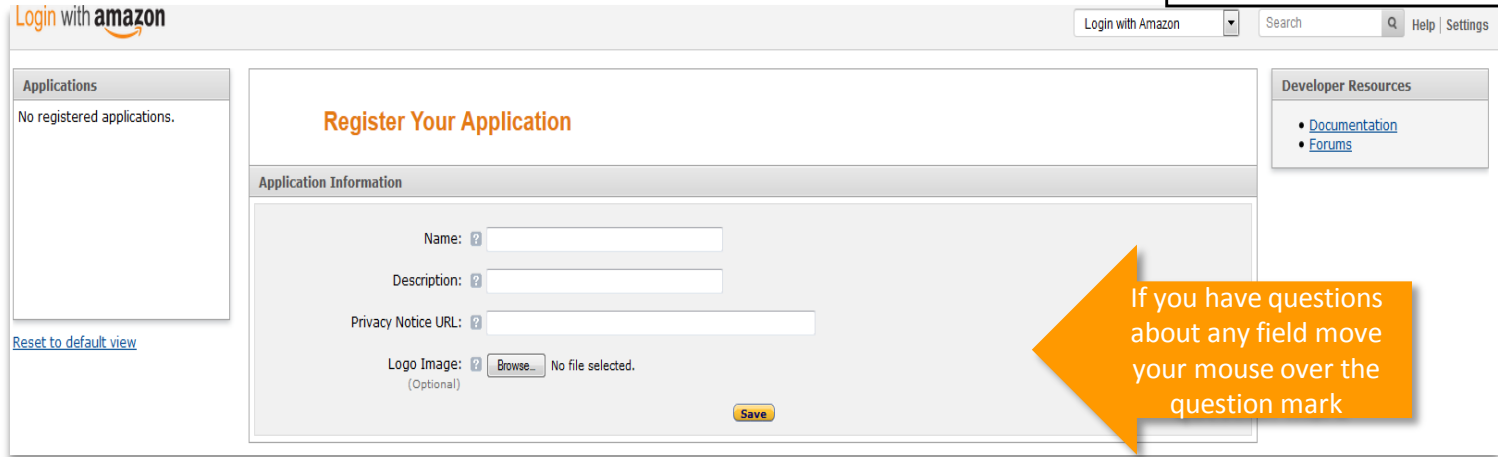

Step 2: Upon clicking the link you will be redirected to the Login with Amazon application console. Click on “Register new Application”.

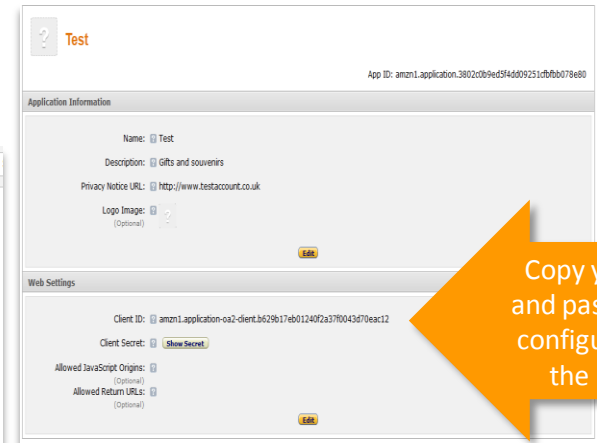
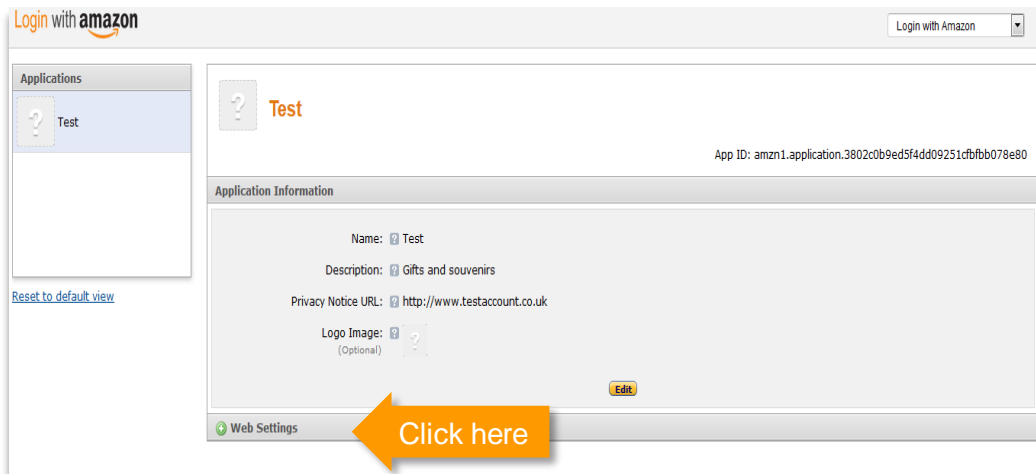

Step 4: Click the “+” sign next to Web Settings to view your Client ID



Make sure you don't use the **App-ID** or the **Client Secret** instead.

Here you can find your client ID, which you must enter in the configuration of your *Login with Amazon* integration.

In any case, you must store here all URLs to the domains on which the *Login/Pay with Amazon* button will be available. You may only enter **https** URLs here. Without a **valid SSL certificate**, the button will not work. Only localhost can be used with http, and for Sandbox testing, a self signed certificate will also do.

If you use the **redirect method** in your shop to login, you must specify also the return URLs. These are all the URLs of the pages on which the customer is redirected after a successful login.

Once you have completed this step by clicking on the Save button, you can use *Login and Pay with Amazon* in your shop.

Step 6 : Go back to the Amazon Payments –UK (Sandbox view) by clicking the toggle on the top right
